

March - July 2020

The programme

Two universities in Bochum are offering a joint programme of study in English each year between March and July.

Specifically designed for students from our partner universities, the programme allows students to earn 30 Credit Points (ECTS) in a blend of regular semester-long seminars and compact courses.

The special focus examines our society's changing nature given the challenge of recent migration and the social and health-related issues this raises.

Courses are interdisciplinary in approach, and allow intercultural insights from the perspectives of our universities as well as international experts from our partner universities worldwide.

»»» Content

The programme is designed for students of Social Work, Inclusion, Public Health, Nursing, Midwifery, Physiotherapy, Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy and interdisciplinary degree programmes in health and/or diversity and related areas.

Applicants must have completed one year of undergraduate study, have English language skills of CEFR level B1 or better, and a home university that partners with EvH RWL or hsg Bochum.

It is also possible to enroll in a 4-week programme. If interested, please contact us individually.

	1	<p>Social Work with Youth and Young Adults – a German-Russian Comparison</p> <p>Prof Dr Dirk Nüsken, Professor of Theory and Practice in Social Work, EvH Bochum Ekaterina Shadrova, PhD in Education, Associate Professor at Volodga State University, Russia</p> <p>Socio-educational work with adolescents and young adults is one of the core elements of social work. In this course, we present current concepts and methods of working with adolescents and young adults from Germany and Russia. Attention will be given to analysing and comparing the challenges involved as well as helpful support strategies that could be engaged. In addition, attention will be given to the question of child protection and social diagnostics with adolescents, as well as the question of "care leavers". 	2	<p>Intercultural Work and the Arts</p> <p>Prof Dr Marichen van der Westhuizen, Associate Professor of Social Work, University of the Western Cape, South Africa</p> <p>This seminar will focus on knowledge, understanding and skills that will enable students to work in multicultural context, with the aim to assist different cultural groups to engage with</p>	



	<p>each other with the specific focus on creating platforms where mutual understanding can develop, prejudice can be addressed and tolerance for differences can be stimulated. Concepts of 'culture', 'multi-culture', and 'inter-culture' will be explored. Focusing on cultural differences we will discuss the situation of Roma in Germany and Hungary. Here the dilemma of social workers is whether to assimilate or integrate. 	<p>5</p> <p>Inclusion Policy - a South African Perspective</p> <p>Ingrid Daniels, Director of Cape Mental Health, South Africa</p> <p>The Apartheid regime prior to the new democracy in 1994 in South Africa constructed and engineered social, political and economic policies and laws based on racial segregation and discrimination. After 1994, the new democratic government of South Africa, with its Reconstruction and Development Policy, the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, No.108 of 1996, and Bill of Rights paved the way for the rights of all persons and sought to afford them dignity, equality and inclusion. Despite our challenges and the slow implementation of policies, South Africa remains a country which offers a great example in policy development and laws to facilitate inclusion and to accommodate diversity of all persons from different cultures, religions, gender, disability and race.</p> <p>Compact course: Friday, 19 June 2020, 14:00 – 19:00 and Saturday, 20 June 2020, 09:00 – 16:30 Friday, 26 June 2020, 14:00 – 19:00 and Saturday, 27 June 2020, 09:00 – 16:30</p> <p>2 CPs: 2 CPs out of 6 CPs in the module “Health, Disability, Diversity”. 	<p>6</p> <p>Human Rights and Disabled Persons from a Disability Studies Perspective</p> <p>Prof Dr Theresia Degener, Professor of Law and Disability Studies, EvH Bochum, and former Chairperson of the UN Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities</p> <p>Dr Sarah Richardson, Lecturer, University of Suffolk, England</p> <p>The United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) of 2006 is widely known and debated. It seeks to bring about a paradigm change from the medical model of disability to the human rights model of disability, but how this can be achieved is less clear. Human rights theories and Disability Studies perspectives are the cornerstones for a proper understanding of the CRPD. 	9	<p>Prof Dr Christiane Falge, Professor for Health and Diversity Studies, hsg Bochum</p> <p>During this seminar, students will be introduced to theories and concepts of diversity in the context of healthcare. Methodologically, we approach diversity issues such as the diversities of migration, poverty, disability and sexual orientation by discussing relevant literature, offering intercultural training sessions, and participating in joint excursions to the life-worlds of the various diversity groups such as religious institutions (mosques, Hindu temples, etc.), disadvantaged neighbourhoods or disability workshops etc. One of the central themes of the course is how to provide better healthcare and health promotion to marginalized people with the overall aim to achieve more equity in health.</p> <p>Weekly course: date to be announced</p> <p>Examination: Seminar paper</p> <p>at hsg Bochum (Hochschule für Gesundheit, University of Applied Sciences)</p>

The EvH RWL

The Evangelische Hochschule Rheinland-Westfalen-Lippe, Protestant University of Applied Sciences (or EvH RWL) educates students for careers in social work, education, diaconal and nursing care professions. Currently, six bachelor and two master degree programmes are offered, of which Social Work is the largest. Founded in 1971, the university is supported by the Protestant Churches in this region and is fully accredited by the State; with ca. 2,400 students, the EvH RWL is the largest of its kind in Germany.

Protestant in origin and ethos, it is an intercultural, inclusive and family-friendly university with what students value as a warm and communicative atmosphere.

The hsg Bochum

The Hochschule für Gesundheit - University of Applied Sciences (or hsg Bochum) offers ten bachelor and four master degree programmes in healthcare professions and health sciences.

Founded in 2009, the state university offers its ca. 1,300 students a modern approach to teaching, close links between theory and practice, early networking with external practitioners, and intensive support during the course of studies. As a partner of the Healthcare Campus North-Rhine-Westphalia, the Hochschule für Gesundheit explores broad perspectives for its students in the healthcare sector.

Once a city prominent as a centre for European coal mining and steel production, Bochum is now widely known as a centre for education and research, healthcare management and new technologies, and describes itself as a “UniverCity,” with seven universities standing in close contact with the city, the chamber of commerce and industry, and other partners.
